Pulaski Solar Community Update:

Construction of Vistra's Pulaski Solar Facility is ahead of schedule and on track to fully energize in 2026. This investment will provide property tax revenue and power to the grid for years to come.

- ✓ Deliveries of panels and equipment complete
- ✓ Road repairs are being completed in coordination with the county
- ✓ The landscape buffering is still stabilizing, and tree replacement will begin this fall
- ✓ Final testing and commissioning of solar panels occurring

Building Up Pulaski County's Tax Base

Roadway Repairs After Construction:

In coordination with Pulaski County, Vistra is paying to repair and improve the conditions of roadways impacted by construction.

Repairing & Replacing the Landscape Buffer:

Partridge Landscaping from Grand Chain is managing the trees and landscape buffer. A tree replacement program will begin this fall and will continue until the buffer is stabilized with healthy trees.

Vegetative Cover & Erosion Control:

In accordance with the County-approved Vegetation Management Plan, a native seed mix has been installed throughout the project area. Low-growth, native vegetation is now establishing in areas disturbed during construction.



Commissioning is underway and panels are generating power.

As the construction project moves from installation to commissioning, skilled members of the trades are safely connecting the panels to the substation and grid. On a field-by-field basis, the panels and wires are generating and transmitting electricity.

For your safety, unauthorized access is strictly prohibited to prevent electrocution or shock. The active site is energized and voltage is present.

Financial Impact **By The Numbers:**

- The project paid a \$2.2 million permit fee to Pulaski County.
- The first year of operations is forecast to generate more than \$3.2 million in property taxes for local governments.
- Overall, the new facility is expected to pay approximately \$57 million in property taxes over the next 25 years.
- The construction provided workers and their families with a projected \$117 million in wages and benefits.

Energy Impact: **Later this year, Pulaski Solar will fully enter service, connect at EEI/Joppa, and unlock 405 new megawatts of electricity, contributing to the resiliency and reliability of our state's power grid.**
